FRENCH BRILLIANT, CAPELLAN SETS FRANCHISE SAVES RECORD IN WIN OVER RAILCATS: The Winnipeg Goldeyes beat the Gary SouthShore RailCats 5-3 at US Steel Yard on Tuesday night. Goldeyes' starting pitcher Parker French came within one out of a complete game shutout, and picked up the win, allowing three earned runs on seven hits in 8.2 innings. French walked four and tied a career-high with eight strikeouts. With the Goldeyes leading 5-0, the RailCats scored three two-out runs before Victor Capellan struck out Andy DeJesus as the tying run at the plate to earn his ninth save of the year. It was also Capellan's 38th save as a Goldeye, setting a new franchise career record. The Goldeyes took a 1-0 lead in the top of the fourth on a Reggie Abercrombie fielder's choice, and made it 2-0 in the sixth on a Kyle Martin bases loaded single. Dominic Ficociello's RBI single and another RBI fielder's choice from Abercrombie in the seventh extended Winnipeg's lead to 4-0. Josh Romanski plated the Goldeyes' fifth run with an RBI single in the eighth. The Goldeyes' offence drew 10 walks, including a career-high four from Alex Perez.

ALL-TIME AGAINST THE RAILCATS: The Winnipeg Goldeyes are 102-81 all-time against the Gary SouthShore RailCats, including a 49-37 record in road games, and a 45-36 record at US Steel Yard. The RailCats joined the Northern League as an expansion team in 2002, and played all of their games on the road. The following year, the RailCats moved into their current home, US Steel Yard. Greg Tagert is in his 15th year as RailCats' manager. Tagert guided the RailCats to the Northern League Championship Series five consecutive seasons from 2005-09, including Northern League titles in 2005 and 2007. The RailCats joined the American Association in 2011 along with the Goldeyes, Fargo-Moorhead RedHawks, and Kansas City T-Bones. Tagert led the RailCats to their third championship in franchise history (and their first in the American Association) in 2013. Tagert also managed nine years in the Frontier League (Ohio Valley, Evansville, Dubois County, Kenosha, and Springfield/Ozark), and held the league's all-time record for managerial wins upon departing for Gary SouthShore. During his first 23 years of managing professional baseball, Tagert has finished with a losing record just once (2015, 45-55). The RailCats were 57-43 in 2017, and won the American Association wild card on the final day of the regular season. In 2018, the RailCats won a franchise-record 59 games and a share of the American Association North Division title. On three occasions since joining the American Association, the RailCats have missed the playoffs by 2.0 games or less. The RailCats finished 1.0 game back of the Central Division lead in both 2011 and 2014, while missing by 2.0 games in 2016. The Goldeyes and RailCats have met twice in the playoffs (2007 and 2008) with the RailCats edging the Goldeyes in both series. Of the nine head-to-head playoff games between the two clubs, seven of them have been decided by three runs or less.

SERIES MATCHUP: The Winnipeg Goldeyes are 15-9, in second place in the American Association North Division, and 1.5 games behind the St. Paul Saints. The Goldeyes just lost two of three to the Cleburne Railroaders at Shaw Park. The Goldeyes are eighth in the American Association in hitting (.252), fifth in pitching (4.15), and first in fielding (.989). The Gary SouthShore RailCats are 10-12, in fifth place in the North, and 5.5 games behind the Saints. The RailCats were just swept in a three-game series by the Sioux Falls Canaries on the road. The RailCats are 11th in the league in batting (.227), third in pitching (3.74), and ninth in defence (.972). This is the second of four head-to-head series this season between the Goldeyes and RailCats. Winnipeg won two of three from the RailCats at Shaw Park earlier this month. The Goldeyes were 5-7 against the RailCats in 2018.

TONIGHT'S STARTERS: The Goldeyes go with left-hander Kevin McGovern who is 2-2 with a 4.50 ERA in five starts this season. McGovern took the loss last Thursday vs. Sioux City, allowing five earned runs on nine hits in 7.0 innings. McGovern walked one and struck out five. McGovern has walked two batters or less in four of his five

starts this year. On May 26th vs. Kansas City, McGovern struck out 11 batters and picked up the win. McGovern's fifth strikeout of that game was his 381st as a Goldeye, which moved him into sole possession of second place on the franchise career list.

In 2018, McGovern was 5-12 with a 4.73 ERA for the Goldeyes in 21 starts and one relief appearance. McGovern finished fourth in the American Association in innings pitched (129.1), third in strikeouts (129), and second in wins above replacement (WAR) among pitchers (3.3). On July 5th of last year at Sioux City, McGovern passed Richard Salazar for second on the American Association's career strikeouts list, while simultaneously setting a new league record for strikeouts by a left-handed pitcher. McGovern's American Association strikeout total currently stands at 559. McGovern moved into second place on the Goldeyes' all-time strikeouts list on May 26th vs. Kansas City, passing Andrew "Ace" Walker (380). Chris Salamida holds the franchise record for strikeouts with 435. McGovern's current Goldeyes' total is 396. On August 10th, 2018 at Chicago, McGovern recorded his 100th strikeout of the season, making him just the second pitcher in American Association history to strike out 100-plus batters in four different years (2015-18).

McGovern was an American Association All-Star for the Goldeyes during their championship season in 2017, finishing tied for first in the league in wins (13), third in ERA (2.56), tied for third in strikeouts (118), fifth in innings pitched (144.1), and fourth in opponent's batting average (.221). On August 18th, 2017 at Fargo-Moorhead, McGovern became just the fourth pitcher in American Association history with three seasons of 100-plus strikeouts.

During the Goldeyes' 2016 championship season, McGovern started and won two of the biggest games in franchise history. On the final day of the regular season (September 5th), McGovern pitched a complete game, two-hitter vs. Fargo-Moorhead in the opener of a double header at Shaw Park. The win allowed the Goldeyes to clinch the American Association wild card. Exactly two weeks later on September 19th, McGovern started Game Five of the American Association Championship Series at Wichita on three days of rest. McGovern allowed two earned runs over 6.0-plus innings to earn the win and help the Goldeyes clinch the title.

McGovern was acquired from the Lincoln Saltdogs on January 27th, 2016 along with left-handed pitcher Conor Spink and a player to be named later in exchange for catcher Luis Alen and outfielder Logan Vick. McGovern is in his eighth season of professional baseball, and is 42-35 lifetime with a 4.06

ERA in 133 games, 107 of them as a starting pitcher. McGovern has struck out 100 or more batters in each of the past five seasons, and has averaged 8.4 strikeouts per nine innings as a professional. McGovern played college baseball at Philadelphia University in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania before beginning his professional career with the Frontier League's Road Warriors in 2012.

McGovern is 2-4 with a 3.00 ERA in nine career starts against the RailCats. McGovern is 2-2 with a 3.35 ERA in seven career starts at US Steel Yard.

The RailCats go with left-hander Lars Liguori who is 2-2 with a 7.14 ERA in six starts this season. Liguori took the loss at Sioux Falls last Friday, allowing six earned runs on nine hits in 5.0 innings. Liguori walked two and struck out three. Liguori had allowed three or fewer earned runs in his previous four starts after giving up eight earned runs in 1.1 innings in his first start of the year on May 17th at Chicago. Liguori has walked two batters or less in all six of his starts this season.

Liguori was 4-7 in 13 starts and seven relief appearances for the RailCats in 2018, and finished eighth in the American Association with a 3.52 ERA. In 2017, Liguori was 9-4 with a 3.44 ERA in 17 starts and one relief appearance for the Frontier League's Schaumburg Boomers. Liguori ranked sixth in the Frontier League in wins and 10th in ERA. Liguori is in his sixth season of professional baseball, and is 24-25 lifetime with three saves and a 4.26 ERA in 94 games, 61 of them as a starting pitcher. Liguori has averaged just 2.8 walks per nine innings during his career.

Liguori is 1-3 with a 5.28 ERA in four starts and two relief appearances in his career against the Goldeyes. Liguori is 4-5 with a 3.69 ERA in 10 starts and 17 relief appearances in his career at US Steel Yard.

GOLDEYES MANAGER: Rick Forney is now in his 14th season as Goldeyes' manager, and his 23rd overall within the organization. During his first 13 years at the helm, the Goldeyes have posted a .545 overall winning percentage (698-583), 10 winning seasons, nine playoff appearances, and an American Association-record three championships. Forney was voted American Association Manager of the Year in 2011, and managed the American Association during the American Association/Can-Am League All-Star Game in 2017. Forney's .553 winning percentage in the American Association (2011-18) is the third-highest in league history (there have been 51 total American Association managers through the 2018 season). Forney pitched professionally for 10 years, including four seasons with the Goldeyes. During his playing career, Forney was 89-56 (.614) with a 3.63 ERA, and reached the Triple-A level in 1995.

GOLDEYES MAKE TRANSACTION: The Winnipeg Goldeyes released left-handed pitcher Joel Bender on Friday. Bender was 0-2 with a 4.50 ERA in six relief appearances.

GOLDEYES SIGN SLUGGER MARTIN: The Winnipeg Goldeyes signed first baseman Kyle Martin on June 5th. Martin hit a combined .198 with 10 home runs and 45 RBI last year in 110 games at two levels of the Philadelphia Phillies' organization. Martin blasted 22 home runs in 2017 for the Double-A Eastern League's Reading Fightin' Phils. Martin was drafted in the fourth round by the Phillies in 2015 out of the University of South Carolina (Columbia, South Carolina) where he was a First-Team All-American as a senior.

SWING-AND-A-PIECE: After 24 games, the Winnipeg Goldeyes' collective swinging strike rate is 8.3 percent. The 2018 Major League average swinging strike rate was 11.6 percent. Shortstop Adrian Marin has whiffed just eight times on 243 pitches seen (3.3 percent). Second baseman Alex Perez has swung through just 13 of 354 pitches (3.7 percent).

CHASING 'SAL': Goldeyes' fourth-year left-handed pitcher Kevin McGovern moved into second place on the Goldeyes' career strikeouts list on May 26th vs. Kansas City. McGovern struck out 11 batters, and his fifth of the afternoon was his 381st in a Goldeyes' uniform, moving him ahead of Andrew "Ace" Walker. Chris Salamida holds the franchise record for strikeouts with 435. McGovern's Goldeyes' total currently stands at 396.

CAPELLAN SETS FRANCHISE SAVES RECORD, CHASING LEAGUE MARK: Fourth-year Goldeyes' relief pitcher Victor Capellan earned his 38th save with the club on June 11th at Gary SouthShore. Steve Thomas (2001-03) held the previous record with 37 saves. Capellan tied the Goldeyes' single-season mark with 22 saves in 2018. Capellan is also just 11 appearances back of Dustin Cameron for the American Association's all-time record. Capellan appeared in all 12 of the Goldeyes' postseason victories from 2016-17.

TAILING FORMER FARGO GREAT: Goldeyes' centre fielder Reggie Abercrombie ranks fourth on the American Association's career stolen base list with 168, and is just one steal back of former Fargo-Moorhead RedHawks' shortstop Zach Penprase for third place. Former Goldeye Maikol Gonzalez holds the league's career record with 230, while Brian Fryer is second at 206.

ANOTHER RECORD FOR REGGIE: Goldeyes' centre fielder Reggie Abercrombie set the American Association's all-time record for games played on May 29th vs. Gary SouthShore. Abercrombie appeared in his 694th game since joining the league in 2010, passing former Goldeye Josh Mazzola.

TENURED REGGIE: On May 16th at Texas, Goldeyes' centre fielder Reggie Abercrombie became the first player in American Association history to appear in a 10th season. Abercrombie first joined the league in 2010 with the Sioux Falls Pheasants.

EXPERIENCE THIS: The Goldeyes set a franchise record in their season opener on May 16th at Texas. Eight of the nine players in Winnipeg's starting lineup had Triple-A or Major League experience. The previous record was six, held by the 2015 Goldeyes.

PLAYOFF FORMAT: The American Association maintains the two-division format that was re-introduced in 2018. Both divisions feature six teams. The Goldeyes remain in the American Association North along with the Chicago Dogs, Fargo-Moorhead RedHawks, Gary SouthShore RailCats, Milwaukee Milkmen, and the St. Paul Saints. The Sioux Falls Canaries move to the South Division, and are joined by the Cleburne Railroaders, Kansas City T-Bones, Lincoln Saltdogs, Sioux City Explorers, and Texas AirHogs.

DAIRY DELIVERY: The American Association welcomes the Milwaukee Milkmen as an expansion team in 2019. The franchise is based out of Franklin, Wisconsin, a suburb located 14 miles southwest of downtown Milwaukee. The Milkmen will play at brand new Routine Field, a \$15 Million development with an expected capacity of 4,000. Inclement weather has delayed construction, and the Milkmen expect to formally open Routine Field on June 24th. The club will play its home games in Kokomo, Indiana during the first month of the season. The Milkmen effectively replace the Wichita Wingnuts who were forced to vacate Lawrence-Dumont Stadium in preparation for the arrival of a Triple-A franchise in 2020.

GOLDEYES ENTER 26th SEASON: The Winnipeg Goldeyes enter their 26th season in 2019. The franchise brought professional baseball back to the city in 1994. The Goldeyes were 41-59 in 2018, marking just the fourth time in team history they finished below .500. The Goldeyes have reached the postseason 19 times in their first 25 years, and have won four championships (Northern League 1994, American Association 2012, 2016, 2017).

ALUMNI REPORT: RHP Brandon Kintzler (2007-08) has a 2.51 ERA in 28.2 innings for the Chicago Cubs. Kintzler was an American League All-Star in 2017, saving 28 games for the Minnesota Twins before being traded to the Washington Nationals in July. Kintzler has pitched in the Major Leagues

every season since 2010. RHP Dylan Thompson's contract was purchased by the Boston Red Sox on May 10th, and was 0-4 with a 5.94 ERA in four starts for the High-A Carolina League's Salem Red Sox. Thompson was recently promoted to the Double-A Eastern League's Portland Sea Dogs where he is 1-0 with a 4.50 ERA in one start. RHP Brandon Marklund signed with the Goldeyes in January as a true rookie before having his contract purchased by the Kansas City Royals one week later. Marklund has a 0.96 ERA in 9.1 innings for the Low-A South Atlantic League's Lexington Legends. Infielder Kevin Lachance had his contract purchased by the Arizona Diamondbacks on June 1st.
